Ford Foundation awarded WT one of only four Educational Leadership Grants nationwide. City as Our Campus is an extension of Winchester Thurston's core academic curriculum and augments it by providing meaningful, real-world experiences. Through these courses, students connect with leaders from the academic, cultural, scientific, non-profit and business communities in Pittsburgh as they explore new ideas and conduct research.
